1. Braxton Miller

OB-Ohio State

As expected, Miller performed very well in Urban Meyer's offense in year one. RB-Miami

5. Teddy Bridgewater

QB-Louisville

The number one draft eligible quarterback is set for a star-studded season. Bridgewater put his name on the map after a great Sugar Bowl performance versus Florida. Main target Devante Parker returns and Louisville has a great shot to be undefeated in December, in which we all know helps a Heisman candidate.

6. Jadeveon Clowney

DE-South Carolina

Clowney might be, by far, the most athletic player in college football. But for this defensive juggernaut to win the trophy he must perform well in the biggest games and must make the highlight reel weekly. There's a reason why only one defensive player has ever won the trophy.

7. Todd Gurley

RB-Georgia

Gurley posted stellar numbers in 2012 as a freshman with 17 touchdowns with 1,385 yards. Gurley ended the season strong with 120-plus yards in each of his last two games proving he was one of the best backs in the country. Production won't be an issue in 2013, but getting the carries and yards he needs to win a Heisman may be. If he was the lone runner in the Georgia backfield, he may be #1 on this list.

8. Tajh Boyd

OB-Clemson

Boyd had a spectacular junior campaign throwing for 3,896 yards with 36 touchdowns. Boyd has done wonders in the offense brought to you by Chad Morris and could even see improvement in 2013. 10. TJ Yeldon

RB-Alabama

Yeldon had a solid freshman season as a backup to Eddie Lacy in 2012. He topped the century mark even with the split carries. With a more primary role as a sophomore, Yeldon should easily get to 1,000 yards and possibly push Mark Ingram's record for most rushing yards in a season in school history. (1,658 yards) But Yeldon may have to split carries again with top recruit Derrick Henry.

11. Ka'Deem Carey

RB-Arizona

He led the nation last season in rushing with 1,929 yards.

RB-Oregon
